Wu, of California, to be United States District Judge for the Central District of California; that there be 20 minutes for debate, equally divided between the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Committee on the Judiciary; that at the conclusion, or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on the nomination; that following the vote the motion to reconsider be laid on the table; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then return to legislative session.
